All Mountain Camps and Kids are in for 2009

As Adaptive Adventures heads into its 10th winter season of programming, there is excitement in the air as a new opportunity for children with disabilities to hit the slopes has been created. To meet the growing demand for adaptive ski services for children, Adaptive Adventures will partner with the National Sports Center for the Disabled (NSCD) in Winter Park, Colorado, to host a children's ski camp in 2009. This additional "Stars" youth camp, scheduled for January 2-5, will be the first collaborative effort between Adaptive Adventures and the adaptive ski giant, NSCD. "We are very excited about the opportunity to work with the NSCD this winter" said Joel Berman, Executive Director of Adaptive Adventures. "Our roots are in that program so it only makes sense to work with them and offer another opportunity for kids with disabilities to flourish". In addition to this new camp, Adaptive Adventures will again host our signature Stars camp, which will be held in Steamboat Springs, Colorado from March 21-24. "We are thrilled to be expanding opportunities for disabled skiing in Steamboat to include a camp just for kids," commented Craig Kennedy, the co-founder of Access Anything. "Now we have an adult ski camp, a kids ski camp, and a summer water sports event in Steamboat in 2009. We have come a long way."

Other Highlights of the 2009 season will again include our series of All-Mountain Ski Camps throughout Colorado. The adult camp series will be highlighted by events in Steamboat Springs and Vail. Adaptive Adventures is also pleased to be involved in Snofest again this year. This annual event, which brings thousands of members of the military and their families to Keystone, Colorado, will take place January 28-31, and will once again include the combined efforts of Adaptive Adventures, Keystone Adaptive Center and the U.S. Air Force. "The Snofest event was really incredible last year" said Adaptive Adventures' ski school director Matt Feeney. "The reception and support that the wounded members of the military received from the community and their peers was second to none."

Adaptive Adventures will also lend support

other events around the country in 2008/2009, including the Ski Spectacular in Breckenridge, the Expand your Horizons Camp in Telluride, the Mono-ski Madness Camp in Duluth, Minnesota and the 25th annual Black Hills Regional Ski for Light at Terry Peak, South Dakota. We once again welcome the opportunity to work with other quality organizations around the country and look forward to a season of successful and fun events.



Feeney wins Hal O'Leary Award

The Hal O'Leary Award was presented to Adaptive Adventures Program Director and Co-founder Matt Feeney on September 10 at Coors Field in Denver, Colorado. This award honors an outstanding individual with a disability who has significantly contributed to his or her community through athletic achievement, leadership and dedication to the development of awareness of individuals with disabilities. The recipient is nominated by members of the community and is then chosen by the Hal O'Leary Awards Dinner selection committee.

Wounded Warriors Fly High at Chicago Air and Water Show

From August 13-17, 2008, a group of 20 service members from across the U.S. arrived in Chicago to water-ski, cycle, and kayak as part of the 50th Annual Chicago Air and Water Show. Each was wounded in action during the Iraq and Afghanistan war and wanted to raise awareness for severely wounded veterans. The event was created and organized by Adaptive Adventures, in partnership with the Wounded Warrior Project, the Chicago Fire Fighters Union 2, Disabled Sports USA, the City of Chicago, and many other local community and non-profit organizations.

"There are profound benefits from participation in this type of adaptive recreation, the most significant being the ability to take control of the healing process by learning the tools for a life that transcends injury," said John Melia, Executive Director and Founder, Wounded Warrior Project. "We are grateful to Navistar and Adaptive Adventures for helping to give these Chicago-area warriors access to these events."

The schedule of events began Wednesday, August 13, with a Chicago police and fire escort from O'Hare airport to the Fairmont Hotel located in Downtown Chicago. After a brief moment of rest, the group was escorted to Harry Carray's restaurant for an opening reception that included speeches from Rich Simon, Alderman William Belzer, and General David L. Grange, President and CEO of the McCormick Tribune Foundation. An added - and very unexpected - highlight of the first night occurred when the owners of the House of Blues dropped by and gave the group 40 tickets to the Ted Nugent concert that evening. It was a great show!



Thursday and Friday featured sports activities on the Chicago lakefront. Everyone in the group had a chance to cycle on the lakefront path, water-ski and wakeboard in the shadow of the John Hancock Center, as well as kayak on the Chicago River through Downtown. "I am from the Chicago area, but have never had a chance to experience the city from this perspective," beamed local Warrior Brian Wilhelm.

On Friday, after a morning filled with activities, the group headed over to North Avenue Beach for the start of the Air Show and a concert featuring the Lt. Dan Band. A highlight of the show was when Chicago icon and legendary funny man Bill Murray came into our area and spent nearly 30 minutes talking to the Warriors. "The highlight of the day for my family and me was to meet and spend some time with Bill Murray," noted one soldier. After the concert, the group was treated to a dinner and ceremony at the Italian American Club.

Athlete Spotlight: Stephanie Jallen - Age 13

Stephanie Jallen was born with a rare birth defect called CHILD Syndrome (congenital hemi-dysplasia with ichthyosiform erythroderma and limb defects). Hemi-dysplasia means it only affects half of her body with Ichthyosis which is a severe skin disorder. Her left side never fully developed, leaving her arm very short and tapered down to one digit. Her leg also had to be amputated when she was an infant.

Despite her difficult challenges, Stephanie stays very active. She plays on an undefeated soccer team (using her one leg and a cane), rides a special trike and, when the skin disorder rash doesn't prevent her from wearing her prosthetic leg, she plays on a basketball team, roller blades and enjoys many other activities.

Her passion for all sports led her to a youth ski camp four years ago at the local ski area, Camelback, Pennsylvania. Stephanie was such a cute and vivacious young lady that everyone at Camelback was drawn to her. Although, many ski instructors wanted to put her in a bi-ski to take her up the mountain the 'easy' way, she refused to be handled by the instructor restraining her and controlling the bucket. Stephanie wanted to ski on her own. Mau Thompson, now the ASK program coordinator for Adaptive Adventures, commented, "I have another athlete who skis on one leg with the support of one arm holding an outrigger but that's not really an easy way to learn how to ski, especially for a 9 year-old kid."

Stephanie decided to give it a try. Something about Stephanie made Mau think that she could do it. Mau was ready for the challenge and knew Stephanie would love skiing independently.

During the next four days, Stephanie fell a lot! With only one side of her upper body providing support, it was difficult for her to balance upright. Stand up, slide and fall, stand up again, slide and fall. Stephanie repeated that on the bunny hill all day long. When she came back to the lodge for the lunch break, she ate tons of food and fell asleep on a chair. "Stephanie skied literally until she dropped" her new coach Mau recalled.

Stephanie never complained. She did not complain about how tired her leg was, how tough it was to ski with one leg or how frustrating it was to fall down all the time. Stephanie enjoyed the experience she had at that camp and it showed in her smile. Mau noted, "Stephanie could not get off of the bunny hill during her first ski camp, but I realized that she loves speed and has a strong competitive mind. On the last day of the camp,

we had a race on the intermediate hill so I decided to take her with me to show her what a ski race looks like. I skied through the racecourse with Stephanie on my back!"

Now Stephanie at 12 years old has committed herself to becoming a Paralympic ski racer and to represent the USA on the US Disabled Ski Team. Stephanie is one of the regular participants at the STARS of Tomorrow youth sports camps throughout the year. To learn more about Stephanie visit her website at www.stephaniejallen.org

Michigan Adaptive Sports provides opportunities for persons with disabilities to participate in snow skiing, water skiing, sit wakeboarding, and kayaking. This year, with the help of Matt Feeney and Joel Berman from your group, and Adam Scott from Disabled Sports USA and the Wounded Warriors Project, we put on a very impressive one-day summer sports clinic. In all, we had 34 participants, including 5 participants from the Wounded Warriors Project and 5 athletes training for the Extremity Games. Michigan was also host to the Extremity Games this year, with athletes from around the country competing in various sports such as wakeboarding, kayaking, mountain biking, rock climbing, motorcross, and skateboarding. With sponsors like Easter Seals and Wright & Filippis, it was a success.

Michigan Adaptive Sports also hosts an end of summer weekend camping event at a wonderful campground in Milford called Camp Dearborn. The campground has living accommodations already set up, barrier-free bathrooms, and five small lakes. We provide kayaking, swimming, handcycling, fishing, tennis, golf and basketball, as well as all meals and a Saturday night barbeque with DJ and dancing. We can accommodate up to 75 participants and their families, and we'd love to have you join us next year.
